

IN MY MOM ERA PLATE

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects



MATERIALS

CCX151 10" Coupe Plate
Medium Brush
Small Brush
Liner Brush
Fan Brush
NCR Pattern
Ballpoint Pen

COLORS

CMM 14 - Gum Drop
CMM 19 - Banana Boat
CMM 55 - Sea Mist
CMM 91 - Blue Ice
CMM 5 - Coral Reef
CMM 16- Chiffon
CMM 76 - Lemon Mist
CMM 3 - Carnation



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Thin down some Gum Drop paint with 60% paint to 40% water. Use a fanbrush to apply two coats of the watered-down paint to the top of the plate.
- 2. Allow the background to dry for a few minutes.
- 3. Apply the NCR pattern of the words to the center of the plate by pressing firmly with a ballpoint pen as you trace over the lines.
- 4. Use the NCR pattern to fill in the remainder of the plate with different-sized flowers, allowing the flowers to go off the edge of the plate.
- 5. Fill in the letters, smiley face, and peace hand with 3 coats of your desired colors using a small brush. We used: Sea Mist, Banana Boat, Coral Reef, and Blue Ice.
- 6. When you fill in the smiley face, leave the eyes and mouth unpainted. They'll show up in the same color as the background of the plate after firing.
- 7. Paint the flowers with three coats of your desired colors, selecting from Chiffon, Lemon Mist, and Carnation. Choosing lighter colors than the letters will help the letters pop.
- 8. Use a detail brush to fill in the centers of the flowers with 3 coats of either Sea Mist, Coral Reef, Banana Boat, or Blue Ice.
- 9. Use a liner brush to outline the peace hand. Select a color that contrasts the color you painted the hand, we use Coral Reef.

TIPS

- Three coats of paint on the letters and flowers will result in a vibrant solid color.
- If you decide to change up the colors, make sure to paint the background in a light color, the flowers in medium colors, and the letters in darker colors. This will ensure that everything pops.
